






As part of the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM) Cheshire and Wirral Maths Hub, the team collaborate with schools to support the continuous improvement of mathematics education for students from a range of school in the Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester. Halton and the Wirral districts.

Mrs Blagg said, "It is a privilege to have the opportunity to showcase some of the innovative and forward-thinking ways we work with our students, by hosting a range of continuing professional development (CPD) events and workshops for local maths teachers here at school and online. In these sessions, we've worked with other schools to guide their planning and lesson studies, and allowed them to observe our students in action. Being part of the Maths Hub, not only benefits our school through the support of action research, but enables students all over the region to access the very latest teaching approaches to set them up for positive success and achievement in Maths."
