

There is growing concern about the prevalence of young people using vapes, also known as E-cigarettes, and the negative effects on their health and wellbeing.

#### "IF YOU HAVE NEVER SMOKED YOU SHOULD NEVER VAPE."

Whilst vapes are an important and successful tool to help adults quit smoking, they have also come to be seen as a risk free alternative to smoking.

But with brightly coloured packaging and enticing flavours, increasing numbers of young people, with some as young as primary school age, seem to be taking up vapes with the long term associated health risks still unknown.

#### USE YOUR VOICE TO ADDRESS VAPE USAGE IN YOUNG PEOPLE

We're asking you to support Halton Borough Council and the public health department in developing a strategy to address vape usage among young people, by encouraging your child to take part in an online survey in school before the 30th April.

The survey is optional, but the more young people who take part the better a picture we will have of vape usage in Halton.

# Attendance ARE YOU IN? MATTERS

When we talk about attendance at school, we are talking about so much more that 'bottoms on seats'.

Being in school is important for accessing education, but it is also key to developing vital life skills from making friends and taking part in extra curricular clubs to effective communication and developing their wellbeing in general.

But we also know that it can be harder for some children to attend school every day than it is for others.

If you are finding attendance at school a challenge, our attendance team are always here to provide you and your child with the support they need to access the education they're entitled to.

Sometimes it can be tricky to know whether to send your child into school if they're feeling unwell. The NHS has a handy guide to help you.

#### Did you know?

There are 175 non-school days in the year.

That's 175 days to spend on things like visits, holidays, shopping, and other appointments.

Unauthorised absences can have the biggest impact on attendance.

Here are just a few examples of when it's not acceptable or appropriate to miss school:

- Leave of Absence NOT approved by school, for example, holidays in term time
- Absence NOT reported on the day or supported by written explanation upon return to school.
- Absence of 5 or more days WITHOUT medical evidence.
- Routine Doctor/Dental appointments.
- Arriving late after registers have closed.
- Truancy (both internal & external).
- Shopping
- Hair cut
- Airport visits
- Birthday treats
- Days out / trips
- Looking after brothers and sisters at home
- Oversleeping
- Working

# P&P VALUES | COMPASSION

Three of our Year 9 students were recognised for their heroism last week, after coming to the aid of a distressed infant on a busy road in Widnes as they made their way to school that morning.

The quick-thinking group stayed with the four-year-old and reported the lost child to Cheshire Constabulary, comforting him and keeping him safe until the police were able to reunite him with his mother.

The child's father said, "This morning, my four-year-old autistic son ran away from his mother and was unable to be found in between this time. After a frantic search with multiple people, he was identified by three pupils from Saints Peter and Paul High School, who held onto him and called the police. I cannot commend and thank these three young people enough.

Without their intervention, the circumstances and probabilities could have been a lot worse, and I would like not just to thank and offer my unwavering support for these three individuals in the actions they took, but also thank the school for educating and presenting this mindset in this type of situation."

School Principal Danielle Scott said, "We are immensely proud of the fast and thoughtful actions of Georgina, Sam, and Alfie, ensuring a positive outcome in what could have been a dangerous situation, and we are so pleased to hear that the young boy they found is now safely at home and doing very well. All three have been celebrated by their year group progress leader and members of our senior leadership today in recognition of the calm, mature and compassionate response they provided, and we are sure that their ability to keep a cool-head in stressful circumstances will stand them in good stead for the future. Well done to them all."
