She continues to go from strength to strength, and deserves particular recognition for the enormous task she's taken on with a small amount of training and a tight timescale for preparation.





TIPS TO STAY SAFE ONLINE

There are lots of things you can do to keep yourself safe online.

Think before you post

Don't upload or share anything you wouldn't want your parents, carers, teachers or future employers seeing. Once you post something, you lose control of it, especially if someone else screenshots or

Don't share personal details

Keep things like your address, phone number, full name, school and date of birth private, and check what people can see in your privacy settings Remember that people can use small clues like a school logo in a photo to find out a lot about you.

Watch out for phishing and scams

Phishing is when someone tries to trick you into giving them information, like your password. Someone might also try to trick you by saying they can make you famous or that they're from a talent agency. Never click links from emails or messages that ask you to log in or share your details, even if you think they might be genuine. If you're asked to log into a website, go to the app or site directly instead.

Think about who you're talking to

There are lots of ways that people try to trick you into trusting them online. Even if you like and trust someone you've met online, never share personal information with them like your address, full name, or where you go to school. Find out more about grooming.

Keep your device secure

Make sure that you're keeping your information and device secure.

Never give out your password

You should never give out your password or log-in information. Make sure you pick strong, easy to remember passwords.

Cover your webcam

Some viruses will let someone access your webcam without you knowing, so make sure you cover your webcam whenever you're not using it.



Unless you change your privacy settings, anyone can see you **and** any posts you submit to Snapmaps.



THE FAMILY CENTER



The Family Center was introduced by Snapchat in August 2022 to enhance Snapchats safeguarding element when it comes to teen accounts.

Snapchat states that their users must be over the age of 13 years, but we know that this does not necessarily mean that the users are over 13.

The family center allows a teen user account and a parental user account to be linked. This allows the parental account to view their teens friends, see who they are messaging (you cannot see content of those messages).

Do you know who your children are **speaking to** on Snapchat?

Their "best friends" will be who they speak to the most. But any of their contacts can see their "stories" and message them.

Make sure they only add or accept people **they know**.

The state of the s

"My Eyes Only" is a section of Snapchat where you can save stories or images which are **locked by a passcode** set by the user.

These images are only visable when the passcode is entered, the passcode cannot be recovered by Snapchat.

Investigations have highlighted this is the section where children are saving and storing indecent images of themselves, or other children.

It is <u>illegal</u> to take, possess or share indecent images' of anyone under age of 18 - Including yourself



For children and families with medical & clinical conditions attendance at school can often be a source of worry.

ATTENDANCE

If you haven't already, please contact your child's progress leader to discuss how we can best support their education and learning.

As a parent, you are legally responsible for making sure your child gets a suitable full-time education.

School is one of the best ways to access that education, and we're here to support you in helping your child attend as much school as possible.

To help us help you, you can:

- Promote positive and healthy attendance patterns with your child and set good bedtime and morning routines.
- Ensure your child arrives at school every day, on time and equipped and ready to learn.
- Ensure we have at least three up-to-date addresses and telephone numbers so we can contact you quickly when required.
- Report absence via Class Charts before 8:30am each day until your child returns to school.
- Ensure medical appointments are made outside of school time.
- Avoid making holiday requests during term time.
- Contact school if you are experiencing difficulty getting your child to attend school.
- Work with the school and any other agencies of support to resolve any difficulties which may affect regular school attendance.

FAO Parent/Carers in Halton

Dear Parents and Carers in Halton,

The guidance issued by the Department for Education in 2022 in relation to School Attendance (Working Together to Improve School Attendance) has now been updated and becomes statutory from 19th August 2024.

The guidance outlines the responsibilities and expectations of schools (including governing bodies), and Local Authorities in relation to school attendance as well as reminding parents of their responsibilities.

In supporting all of our schools to improve their attendance we would like to highlight the expectations on parents in relation to school attendance within the new DfE guidance and encourage you to work with your child's school if there should be any concerns or issues impacting on attendance.

Information on the school's procedures and who to contact regarding attendance will be available on your child's school website over the coming weeks as they prepare for the guidance becoming statutory in August 2024.

The expectations on parents are:

- That you will ensure that your child attends school regularly (as defined by the Supreme Court in 2017 as every day the school is open except when a statutory reason applies) and that you notify the school as soon as possible when your child has to be unexpectedly absent
- That you only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances and that
 you do so in advance (it is the Headteacher's decision on what is deemed
 'exceptional' as the priority is for your child to attend school every day but
 generally, the DfE does not consider a holiday or other absence for the
 purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.
- That where possible you book medical appointments around the school day but when this cannot be avoided and your child has an appointment in school time you notify the school in advance (and if your child attends the appointment in uniform, they can return to school afterwards)
- That you work with your child's school and the Local Authority to help with the understanding of any barriers to your child attending school regularly. (Please contact your schools attendance team in the first instance, who will

ATTENDANCE

Guidance for school attendance set by the Department for Education will become statutory from the 19th August.

This letter from Halton Borough Council explains what this will mean for our families and students:



be happy to help and offer any advice or support with barriers you may be facing.)

That you engage with support offered, such as through our <u>Family Hubs</u> or attending meetings to prevent the need for more formal support.

In addition to outlining the expectations on parents, schools and Local Authorities, the Department for Education has also made changes to penalty notices: The cost of each penalty notice will increase for any offences committed after 19th August to £160 (£80 if paid within 21 days) for the first offence.

One of the changes introduced from 19th August is that where a parent takes the child out of school and commits a second offence within a rolling three year period the penalty notice amount will automatically be set at the £160 (with no reduction for early payment). For any third offence in the rolling three year period there will be no penalty notice but there will be a prosecution.

Penalty notices are issued per parent, per child.

These changes do not take away the possibility of the Local Authority going straight to prosecution for a second offence where a penalty notice has been issued previously and not paid, resulting in a prosecution.

Halton Local Authority will continue to work closely with school leaders, families and support services across the borough to ensure that every child has the best opportunity to achieve their potential.

On behalf of school leaders and our school attendance support services, I want to thank you in advance for your understanding and co-operation as the new guidance is implemented to support the best school attendance for every child in Halton.
