


Guiding Star



TAKING TIME FOR REFLECTION

In September, we launched 'The Reflection Room', a replacement for seclusion, a safe space in school where we proactively address challenges and help students understand the expectations we have here at school.

WHAT IS THE REFLECTION ROOM?

Reflection allows us develop problem-solving skills and resilience when faced with challenges.

The Reflection Room is used as a way to break cycles in negative behaviour patterns, by allowing our students time to reflect, reset and re-charge before returning to the full school timetable.

It gives staff and students the chance to unpick behaviours and incidents, allowing students to voice their concerns about what matters to them and ensure that they feel heard.

HOW DOES REFLECTION WORK?

To support individual needs and differences, Reflection can take place with:

- Year Mentors
- Behaviours Inclusion management
- or the Senior Leadership team

We support in a 1-1 or group setting where we discuss a range of topics, including pastoral support for our students who may be finding it hard to regulate their emotions.

reflection /rɪˈflek.ʃən/ _ noun

the process of taking a step back to find perspective, reduce stress, and recognise areas in need of attention to become a fully aware and understanding participant of life.

understanding who you really are and who you want to become.



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A STUDENT IS RE-REFERRED TO REFLECTION?

When a student completes time in Reflection, they are given the opportunity to return to lessons the next day, as long as they comply and show the that they want to make positive changes.

When a student is re-referred, it can mean that further support is required around the choices they are making in school. Further support could include:

- being placed within a different Reflection area.
- using a specific timetable for your child to attend when in reflection.
- a parental meeting, depending on the effectiveness of previous discussions with your child and what it means to them.

START OF THE DAY

- Students report to reception
- Mr Todd will give the student a seat, a table number, and take their lunch order



12:45 PM

 Students will have lunch in either the school canteen or in their reflection room



11:25 AM

 The student's year team will collect them from the reflection room to complete reflection activities



1:15 PM

 Students return to reflection and complete any tasks or homework on Sparx, Educake or ClassCharts using a laptop/computer/ or on paper



11:50 AM

 Students will be returned to their allocated reflection room to complete work



END OF THE DAY

 Students are escorted to the school gates via reception to leave school.


