
# P+P ALUMNI UPDATE

Our class of 2023 took part in celebrations as they collected their highly anticipated GCSE and BTEC results on Thursday 24th August

These results now mean that many students have secured a place to study their chosen subjects at local sixth form and higher education colleges, with others being able to commence vocational apprenticeship training with local, national, and global companies.

## SUPPORTING YOU TO SUPPORT OUR STANDARDS



From September, students with incorrect or missing items of uniform will be asked to visit our One Stop Shop to borrow the things they need to meet our school standards.

The One Stop Shop will initially work like a swap shop. Students identified as having inappropriate dress will be given a guidance, and will be directed to the shop, located in the hub, to retrieve items like ties, blazers and shoes.

Students will be expected to return borrowed items at the end of the school day and the shop team will keep track of items out on loan around the school.

If you have preloved uniform or PE kits that you would like to donate to the school, please leave clean and reusable items in the donation bin at our reception.



There is evidence to show that the better your child's attendance, the higher their grades will be at the end of Year 11.

This year we're asking all our students to pledge their commitment to achieving over 97% attendance over the school year, by asking 'are you in?'

## OUR SCHOOL DAY & END OF DAY 'CATCH UP'

Students who have followed school expectations and who are punctual will be dismissed from last lesson at 2.50pm every day.

This year we are introducing student 'Catch up' at the end of the day as an immediate consequence for not meeting our school expectations.

Students who meet the following criteria in a school day will be kept behind until the end of the school day at 3.05pm:

- Late for school (arrive to registration after 8.45am)
- Arrive late for 2 or more lessons in the school day or
- Receive two behaviour logs for not meeting school standards

Students who do not complete their 'catch up' session will receive an extended detention as a consequence.

An automatic message will be triggered via Class Charts if your son/daughter is required to stay until the end of the school day at 3.05pm.

If you haven't already, please contact your child's progress leader to discuss how we can best support their education and learning.

# We ask for the support of our parents/carers in supporting good attendance by:

- Promote positive and healthy attendance patterns with your child and set good bedtime and morning routines.
- Ensure your child attends every day, on time and equipped and ready to learn.
- Ensure school has at least 3 up to date addresses and contact numbers.
- Contact School on the first day of absence by 08.30am to provide a reason for absence.
- Contact the school each day of absence until your child returns.
- If contact is not made the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. The school is responsible for deciding if the absence is acceptable or not.
- Provide medical evidence for any absence exceeding 5 days (10 sessions) or more.
- Ensure medical appointments are made outside of school time. If this is not possible, your child needs to be in school prior to and after the appointment. We will need medical evidence upon their return.
- Holiday requests during term time will not be authorised due to the significant impact on progress. Parents/carers who take their children out of school for a holiday may be issued with a Penalty Notice.
- Contact school if you are experiencing difficulty getting your child to attend school.
- Work with the school and any other agencies of support to resolve any difficulties which may affect regular school attendance.
